

Travel Grant Marie Curie Individual Fellowships

Within the Horizon 2020 programme of the European Union – sub-programme „Excellent Science“ the EU offers transnational individual fellowships for young researchers (PhDs). During these Marie Skłodowska Curie Action (MSCA) fellowships (IF) the researcher can perform a project on any field of research at a host organisation located in a country different from the one of his/her residence. The fellow can come from any country (not only from member or associated states) and the projects have a maximum duration of 2 years.

Medical University Innsbruck would like to encourage its researchers to act as host for such projects and apply together with promising researchers at the MSCA scheme for individual fellowships. That's why we offer a travel grant to the upcoming training event at FFG. This grant can only be applied by researchers employed at MUI acting as host, not by the future fellows themselves. The condition for this grant is a valid project proposal at one of the upcoming H2020 MSCA IF calls.
