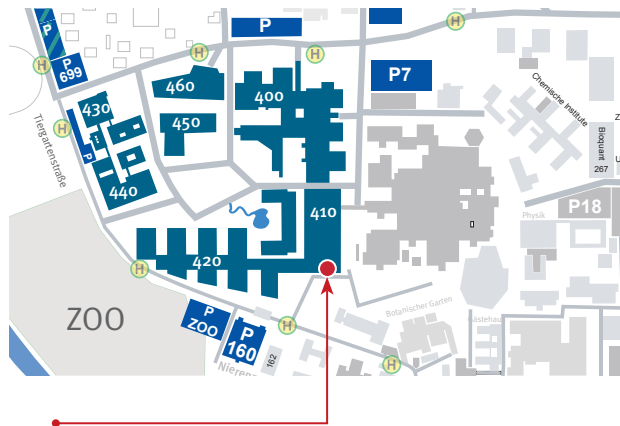

BACKGROUND

Why are significantly more female patients affected by autoimmune diseases than their male counterparts? Why do cardiac disease symptoms differ so greatly between men and women? Why do we observe sex-specific responses to vaccines or immunotherapy?

Understanding how sex and gender influence disease manifestation, their molecular mechanisms, as well as therapeutic response is crucial for advancing personalized medicine, understanding biomedical processes, improving clinical outcomes, as well as to achieve gender equity in healthcare.

The symposium brings together national and international experts from basic science as well as clinical research. Distinguished speakers from different disciplinary backgrounds will provide a comprehensive overview of current trends and future directions in sex- and gender-related biomedical research. The scientific exchange will be rounded off by a panel discussion on how to integrate sex and gender aspects in biomedical research and academic curricula.

This event offers a unique opportunity to explore the intersection of sex, gender, and health, to network with experts, and contribute to critical conversations in this field.
