This lecture is about the amazing advances that reproductive medicine and genetics have made in helping couples to have healthy children. But they also raise a huge number of sensitive questions, and each new development brings fresh controversy as progress marches on towards what could be a post-human future. Of all those involved in the world of medically assisted reproduction, women are most deeply affected because their bodies remain the vital link in bringing children into the world, and they pay a bodily price for the benefits that are gained. In this lecture we will take a look at some of the new practices that are making people uncomfortable and at the ethical debate around them.
