Jo is also author of four health-related books for teenagers, and has published numerous articles in the scientific and consumer health press. She served as Education Officer for the European Medical Writers Association from 2011 to 2014, and teaches courses on writing skills and writing for the internet as part of the EMWA Professional Development Programme. In 2012 she gained an MSc in Cancer Therapeutics from Barts Cancer Institute, London.
