#### The Lush Prize 2016- Animal Free Testing

The Lush Prize is a major initiative aiming to bring forward the day when safety testing takes place without the use of animals. It focuses pressure on toxicity testing for consumer products and ingredients, in a way which complements the many projects already addressing the use of animals in medical testing.

The prize normally consists of a £250,000 annual fund – the biggest prize in the non-animal testing sector.

In most years, several prizes of £50,000 will reward the most effective projects and individuals who have been working towards the goal of replacing animals in product or ingredient safety testing across five strategic areas:

- <u>Lobbying</u>
- Public Awareness
- <u>Science</u>
- <u>Training</u>
- Young Researcher Awards
